

BBC Newnham Shield Club Pairs Championship (Red Points), Saturday 7 March

Our premier club event is coming up straight after the Gold Coast Congress. The event will be run with two grades.

- Open – 9.30am start (all day)
- Under 50 Masterpoints – 1pm start.

All players must be financial BBC members and have played at least 3 times in BBC session games in the past 3 months or may also be accepted at the discretion of the committee. Prior entry is required. You can enter on the BBC website events page, email the club or submit the entry form available at the club. Entries close Tuesday 3 March.

Note: The only play on Saturday 7 March will be the Club Championship. There will be no normal afternoon duplicate pairs on this day.

Wednesday Morning Autumn Pairs (Red Points) 4 & 11 March

9.30am start each morning. No prior entry is required. Everyone plays in the red point sessions. To qualify for the combined sessions overall placing result, you need to play both weeks with the same partner. Cost is coupon or \$7 for members and \$10 for visitors.

Saturday 1pm Green Point Teams – 28 March

Our next Green Point Teams session is Saturday 28 March at 1pm. The aim of these afternoons is for players to experience teams in a friendly club atmosphere. Prior entry is required. To enter, there is an entry list on the blue noticeboard near the front door at the club. Alternatively, you can enter via the BBC website or email the club. Entry can be as a team or a pair to be placed into a team.

Note: There will be no normal pairs session on 28 March. The teams will be the only session.

Club Renovations – An Update

As most of you are aware, in some very exciting news, construction works have commenced at the club.

Work will be carried out in a number of stages over the next several weeks.

Stage 1 is the installation of a Persons with Disability (PWD) toilet upstairs in the kitchen area near the front entrance. This work will take approximately 2 weeks to complete. The entrance through the sliding doors has to be upgraded to meet code and a new ramp will be put in place. Play will continue downstairs as normal, however there will be some noise issues.

Stage 2 is the installation of a PWD toilet facility downstairs. This space will be created by taking some of the lobby area of the female toilets and some space from the office. In addition both the female and male toilets will have an existing cubicle upgraded to the standard of an ambulant toilet (suitable for wheelie walkers, etc.).

Whilst the stage 2 work is being carried out we will be playing our club sessions upstairs. Toilet facilities will be out of bounds so we will be provided with modern, comfortable portable toilet facilities in the form of demountable buildings, for a short period.

Work will also commence on a brand new roof during this time, as weather permits. The new roof will have a pitch and, surely once and for all, fix our leak issues.

Noise will be an issue during this stage and the committee asks for your patience.

After the inside works and new roof are completed, external works will commence. A number of committee members have spoken to both the Brisbane City Council Project Officer and the Building Contractor to stress the importance of our major Easter Congress and the need to have the club available and fully

functional by those dates (12th and 13th April). We have been assured that this has been factored into their timetable and that inside works should be completed.

The external works are mainly in relation to bringing the building up to code. The disabled parking bays have to be levelled, with appropriate distances and bollards in place. The path leading into the club has to be widened and we will be getting a new front door to accommodate wheelchair access.

In addition, the trench running along the building will be repaired and replaced with a concrete gutter. The besser block wall from the Frederick St end of the car park will also be repaired.

All the above works will be done as a capital works program and fully funded by the Brisbane City Council.

While we have contractors on site, it is the best opportunity to have some works done on behalf of the club. We will take this opportunity to have the trough urinal removed and replaced with a number of pedestals and convert the old shower space into a toilet. I am in discussion with council about whether they can absorb some of this cost into their existing budget.

The committee greatly encourage all members to exercise caution when entering and leaving the building. Signage advising only authorised persons are allowed access must be obeyed at all times.

There will be some disruptions over the next several weeks mainly due to noise and having to relocate upstairs and we ask for your cooperation and patience. The committee is delighted that we'll have these improved facilities at our disposal and it will be well worth any trouble in the end.

South opens 3NT which is passed out, and the lead is the 5S.

Beginners are taught to lead towards their high cards – good advice but not always the best.

South won the first trick, unblocked the A K Q of diamonds and led a club to the Queen, trying to reach the diamond tricks that lay tantalizingly in dummy. East took the King of clubs and returned a spade. When West won the Ace of hearts, he cashed his spades to defeat the contract. South complained to North that 6D was the optimal contract and North may well have bid it if he had realized that South would mangle 3NT. After South had unblocked the diamonds, he should lead the Jack of clubs. East must refuse the trick else South would use the Queen of clubs to reach dummy's diamonds.

South can then lead the King of hearts to force the ace, and he then has two spades, two clubs, three diamonds and two hearts for his contract. Easy!
