Coronavirus update

Dear BBC members and friends,

Although the Australian Bridge Federation has recommended that all bridge activities in Australia be suspended for a month or so, it is up to the individual clubs to decide how to proceed. The QBA committee is currently discussing what they will recommend.

It is the BBC committee's consensus that while all clubs will be affected to some degree by the pandemic, it is not the time for everyone to selfquarantine. Many of our members and friends rely on the social contact and mental stimulation provided by regular bridge games. So, for the present, BBC will continue with its scheduled bridge sessions, as long as there is sufficient player attendance and there are directors available and willing to direct. 'Social distancing' as currently recommended by the Australian government does not mean 'social isolation.'

The question of whether the Easter Congress will proceed as planned is under active consideration as the situation develops. As soon as a firm decision is made, all members and those registered will be contacted.

The decision to stay open at this time relies on individual BBC members and friends taking seriously their responsibility to look after themselves and each other in the following ways:

- Do not come to the club if you have any symptoms, or feel unwell in any way, or have had contact with anyone who is ill, has returned from overseas, or is awaiting test results for corona virus.

- Do not come to the club if you have any concerns about your own health or that of your family members and other close contacts, as you would not want to pass any infection on to them.

- Practice good hygiene. Wash your hands properly with soap and water (this is more effective than hand sanitizers). If you have to sneeze or cough, use a tissue or your arm. Do not use the cards or your hands.


The committee trusts the membership of BBC to fulfill their duty in the above ways.

Building Update

This Wednesday we will relocate the office and dealing machine upstairs.


Unfortunately there is now no chance that the work downstairs will be completed in time for our Easter Congress. An additional portable toilet block will be used over that weekend.

Bridge hand



The bidding was simple, South opened 1NT and North put him immediately to 3NT.

The opening lead was the QH from West. Now most South's when faced with this deal would

win the opening lead with the Ace and attack diamonds, dummy's long suit. This plan fails because the opening lead has left South lagging in the race for tricks. East would win the first diamond and return a heart, and West would unblock an honour under declarers King. When West takes the next diamond, the defenders cash three heart tricks to defeat the contract. South improves his chances by ignoring diamonds and attacking clubs but even here he must be careful. If he leads a low club towards dummy's jack, East wins and clears hearts. When clubs break 4-2, South has only eight tricks. Good technique would be to get to dummy with a high spade at trick two and lead a club towards the two honours in his hand. After the king of clubs wins South returns to dummy to lead another club. When East's Ace pops up South is sure of three club tricks, four spade tricks and two heart tricks – game made.
