BBC GNOT Heat - Teams with Gold Points (Sunday 23 May, Whole Day Event)

BBC Graded Butler Pairs (Sunday 30 May, 9:30am)

BBC's next congress is coming up on Sunday 30 May. So what is Butler scoring? The Butler scoring method uses IMP's, which is how Teams are scored, instead of Matchpoints which we play at our usual sessions. In Butler scoring the Declarer's top priority is to make their contract while the Defender's priority should be to defeat the contract rather than simply trying to limit the number of overtricks. The cost is \$30 per player (\$60 per pair). The entry link is available online via the BBC website. Entries close after Wednesday 26 May, so please enter soon.

Cold & Flu Season

With the cooler weather around here is your reminder to get the flu vaccine. Even with no non-quarantined Covid cases in Brisbane, it is important to remember the following ...

- If you are sick, or have cold/flu symptoms please think twice before coming to bridge. We rather you get well than sharing your cold or the flu with others at the bridge table.
- If you do need to cough at the bridge table, please cough into a tissue, handkerchief or your shoulder. Do not cough into the playing cards or on your hands.
- It is recommended that people wait at least 14 days between a dose of seasonal flu vaccine and a dose of the Covid-19 vaccine. The 14-day time frame is a precautionary measure to manage the common side effects that come with many vaccinations.



Dlr:South Vul: N-S



South opened 1NT and North bid 3NT.

West led a small Heart and South, thrilled with the 'gift' of a free finesse, won the trick with the Jack of Hearts. The contract was now doomed! South then attacked clubs and East took the second club trick with the Ace and led another Heart. Declarer went up with the Ace of Hearts and tried to reach dummy with the Queen of Spades. When East produced the King declarer finished with only seven tricks. South makes game if he pays a fair price for the first trick – the King of Hearts. West then cannot prevent declarer from winning a Heart trick in dummy and thus enjoying the established Clubs.
