BBC Graded Butler Pairs (Sunday 29 May, 9:30am)

Monday Morning June Pairs – Red Points (6 & 13 June, 9:30am)

9:30am start each morning. No prior entry is required. Everyone plays in the red point sessions. To qualify for the combined sessions overall placing result, you must play both weeks with the same partner. The cost will be a coupon for members and \$10 for visitors.

BBC GNOT Heat - Gold Points (Sunday 19 June, 9:30am)

A team can consist of 4 - 6 players. Prior entry is required. You can enter on the BBC website events page, email the club or submit the entry form available at the club. The cost for the GNOT is \$120 per team. If you wish to be a contending team, you much have no more than one non BBC financial member. For teams who are contending, you must attend the Zone Final and National Final if successful in each stage. Entries for the GNOT Heat close Wednesday 15 June at 1pm.



Bridge hand:

Henk Bomgaars drew my attention to a hand in the book *Mind Games* that he thought might be of interest to readers of the Newsletter. Allegedly a hand that was actually played as described, it looks more like a hand constructed to show that it is possible to make a grand slam with as few as a combined six points.



The bidding:

West's opening 2D bid was a game force and most of the others are obvious with the exception of South who felt he had enough to bid 4S.

East led a diamond which was trumped in the North hand, a heart return was trumped in dummy, a Spade lead from dummy drew the Jack from West and was won by the Queen in the North hand. Another Heart from North was trumped in dummy and a diamond was led to a small Spade in the North hand. A third Heart was played from North and ruffed in dummy. The East/West hearts broke 3-3, so another Diamond led from dummy could be trumped by declarer, the remaining trump drawn by North's Ace and declarer then had trumps and four good Heart tricks. Grand Slam made and never in doubt? If you believe that you believe anything.
