Bridge Hand

Seated at the bridge table how often do you say, when dummy appears (and I'll put it politely), "Oh, that's not what I expected!" Often, when disconcerted by an unexpected dummy, it is possible to mis-play the hand. To borrow a injunction from golf ... 'play it as it lies'

Α **Y** K 10 5 2 ♦ 76432 **♣** A Q 3 **♦** Q J 10 6 ♦98743 **9** 6 **♥** J 7 ♦ A Q J **8** 5 ♣ 10 8 6 5 ◆ KJ97 **★** K 5 2 **Y**AQ843 ♦ K 10 9 **♣** 4 2

North opened the bidding with 1D, South bid 1H which was supported by North, and South, encouraged by a potential double fit in the red

suits, jumped to game. On the lead of the ♠Q
Declarer took the Ace, drew trumps and lead a
diamond from dummy to finesse with the 9.
West won the Jack and led a club. Dummy's
Queen lost to the King, and East's diamond
return gave West two more tricks for down one.

South was deeply unimpressed telling North that if his A Q was in the suit he bid, 11 tricks would have been simple. North, equally unimpressed, said the contract can make if you simply "play it as it lies".

After South draws trumps he takes the ♠K pitching a club from dummy, ruffs a spade, cashes the ♠A and exits with the ♣Q for an endplay. East wins and must return a diamond to avoid a ruff and discard. South plays the 9, West wins but must then cash his ♠A or concede a ruff and discard. Either way South gets his 10th trick. I told you it was an easy game.
