Bridge Hand

Rules are for the obedience of fools and the guidance of wise men (and women)

The mindless adherence to *Bridge Rules* has always been a source of annoyance to me but I am renowned as an ill-disciplined and inveterate swashbuckler. Take that old chestnut "you must return your partners lead". At one time the only excuse for shifting was you were void in that suit or sudden death had intervened, and even then some players I can think of would complain. Have a look at this hand:

Dlr: South Vul: N-S **♦** 6 4 **9**653 ♦ KJ 10 7 6 3 ♣ A J **♦** J 9 8 5 **♠** Q 10 3 ♥J8742 **Y** A 10 **†** 2 ♦ A Q 4 ♣873 ◆ 9 6 5 4 2 **♠** A K 7 2 **♥** K Q 9 985 **♣** K Q 10

South opened the bidding with INT and North bid 3NT. The opening lead was the ♥4 which was taken by West with the Ace and he then thoughtlessly followed the *rule* and returned the ♥10. This play presented declarer with his contract. He won the King and led the ◆9 for a finesse.

East played low but took the next diamond and led a spade. South won the Ace, lost to the ◆A and ended up with 10 tricks.

East must forget the idea of returning partner's lead. On the bidding West can have at the most three points, and quite probably one or two. For this reason the Heart suit cannot be a source of adequate defensive tricks.

East defeats the contract by switching to a Club at the second trick, threatening dummy's entries.

When East wins the second Diamond with the Queen, he leads a second Club. The Diamond suit is now dead and south can only win one diamond, two spades, two hearts and three clubs.

Contract one down, though if this stops West whinging about partner's failure to return his lead is anybody's guess.

A Bridge Expert is a person who can tell you more about the game than you really care to know.


A Bridge match is a test of your skill against your opponents' luck.
