One of the hardest things in bridge is focus after a bidding mishap gets you into a silly spot. It's important to concentrate on the immediate problem and not let yourself get distracted by what might have been. In the recent interclub championship this hand appeared:

- 1. 15-17
- 2. 4+/4+ in the majors
- 3. Partner thought we were playing system on and tried to transfer to spades...
- 4. And I thought we'd agreed the cue was an invite or better hand asking for a heart stop.

Oh dear. As you can see, 2S was an easy contract despite the split, losing 3 spades and one or two hearts depending on the defence for +110 or +140. It looked like I was going to lose a number of 100s in 2NT, but you never know your luck and the quality of the defence. And my job was to minimize the damage.

I got the helpful ♠Q lead, winning with the ♠K. I led ♠9 to West's ♠J, more to put West on lead again for some more help rather than a futile attempt to set up spades.


West led  $\mathbf{K}$ , which I ducked, and  $\mathbf{T}$  to East's  $\mathbf{Q}$  and my  $\mathbf{A}$ .

I played AQ to East's AK and East returned a diamond to my 10, clearing the suit.

I played 3 further rounds of winning clubs, delighted to see the 3-3 break and even more delighted to see East discard a heart. Given East was the only one now with diamonds, hearts were her only possible entry and she should have been holding them like grim death and throwing diamonds.

I led a low heart (West ducking with ♥A) to the ♥K and the pleasing ♥Q fell from East's hand.

This was the picture:



I had 7 tricks in the bag (3 clubs, 2 diamonds,  $\forall K, \& K$ ). I just led & 10 and West could take their & A and  $\forall A$  but had to give me the  $\forall J$  at the end for +120.

We ended up gaining on the board when the opponents at the other table overbid to 4S, going 2 off for +200 to our teammates!
