Policy Document – Arriving Without a Partner

BBC currently offers a few sessions where players may arrive without a partner and are guaranteed a game (Tuesday PM, Thursday AM Supervised sessions and Saturday PM Duplicate).

PLEASE NOTE that the Saturday session is dependent on whether our regular director Neil Hansen is directing on that day. If he is absent and we have another director, we are not able to guarantee a game. You must check well beforehand if this is the case if you intend to arrive without a partner.

I would also like to reiterate the BBC policy of arriving without partners below:

Brisbane Bridge Centre provides a service to players on the odd occasion when their regular partner is unavailable. These players may arrive without a partner at certain designated sessions.

For sessions where players may arrive without a partner the following policy applies:

- Players arriving without a partner must arrive at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start time for the session.
- Players arriving without a partner must be prepared and willing to play with any other player who arrives without a partner.
- Players arriving without a partner should be mindful of Law 74. They should avoid any action or remark that may cause embarrassment to another player or interfere with their enjoyment of the game.
- If partnered with the Director, players arriving without a partner must be prepared and willing to sit NS if the Director prefers.
- All players must be prepared to assist the

Director by moving and sitting as requested.

- Arrival without a partner should be occasional and not become a regular occurrence.
- Players should not arrive without a partner unless they are prepared to abide by the policy.


Bridge Hand

The Morton's Fork Coup is used to describe a play when, like the victims of Henry VII's Chancellor Cardinal Morton, whatever the defender does is wrong.

The Morton's Fork was a specious but neat way of collecting taxes by John Morton (1420-1500) who believed that those who lived richly could clearly afford to pay taxes, and those who lived frugally must have saved money and therefore too could pay taxes.

This no-win situation can be transferred to the bridge table thus:

Playing in a contract of 6H South received the lead of a trump and seems in danger of losing a diamond and a club. However declarer draws trumps – and see then the effect of leading a small diamond towards the Q 3 2 in dummy. West has no recourse. If he rises with the Ace dummy's Queen will be established for a second club discard (the spade suit taking care of one club loser). If West ducks the diamond lead declarer is able to discard the King of diamonds from his hand on a spade, just losing one club. Heads I win, Tails you lose.
