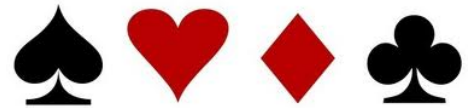

SNOOPY

Charles M. Schulz, the creator of Peanuts, was an enthusiastic bridge player. It was not a coincidence that one of his iconic characters, Snoopy, also took up bridge in several cartoons.

Snoopy - and his partner Woodstock - were named Honorary Life Masters by the American Contract Bridge League in 1997.

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Bridge Hand

The Morton's Fork Coup is used to describe a play where, like the victims of Henry VII's Lord Chancellor Cardinal Morton, whatever the defender does is wrong.

The Morton's Fork was a specious but effective way of collecting taxes by John Morton (1420-1500) who believed that those who lived richly could clearly afford to pay taxes, and those who lived poorly or frugally must be saving money and therefore could also afford to pay taxes. This no-win situation can be transferred to the bridge table thus:

♠ K Q 4
♥ A J 5 4
♦ Q 3 2
♣ 10 5 2

♠ 9 8 7
♥ 10 3
♦ A 9 8 4
♣ K 9 8 4

Immaterial

♠ A 2
♥ K Q 9 8 7 6
♦ K 7
♣ A Q J

Playing in a contract of 6H South received a trump lead and is in danger of losing a diamond and a club. However, declarer draws trumps, and now see the effect of leading a small diamond towards the Q 3 2 in dummy. West has no recourse. If he rises with the Ace dummy's Queen will be established for a second club discard (the spade suit taking care of one club loser). If West ducks the diamond lead declarer is able to discard the King of diamonds from his hand on a spade, and just lose one club.
